Richard has been at the Club off and on for around 50 years and has held various positions on the Committee. When the club was beginning in 1957, he went to the rear of the Woodville Town Hall to be coached by Barry Jones, and for 2/- (Two shillings) you got 10 minutes of coaching. Richard played for the Club in 1979 and brought his sons to be coached. He played in the Winter Pennant teams and the Club summer competition. He joined the committee in 1996, became Treasurer in 1997 and stayed in that position until 2012, and was Club President in 2004. He was awarded Life Membership in 2004. He is still on the Club committee doing odd jobs.
